



Each section measures 3 1/2"

Slit only to bottom of flap

Score each at 1/2" down for flap.
Use 1/2 inch double sided tape to
tape onto to main pages.
I just run an exacto knife lightly
across to make a slight cut so it folds
easily

Come to a stop
